The Minnesota Federation of Music Clubs meets twice a year in locations around the state. JC STUDIO and JC INSTITUTE • The 2012 Artist in Residence is a fantastic professional string quartet from St. Paul — the Artaria String Quartet. They will do readings of student-composed scores for string quartet. Brooke Joyce, guest composer from Luther College in Iowa, will work with the students during the first week. Faculty for the Studio and the Institute are Randall Davidson, Linda Tutas-Haugen, Dr. Sarah Miller, and Dr. Seth Custer.

The final salons for JCS and JCI students will be on Saturday, July 21.

JC's collaboration with the Minnesota Sinfonia will continue another year. Jay Fishman, Artistic Director of the Minnesota Sinfonia, has extended a call for submissions to the second annual Composition Contest. The winning string quartet piece will be part of the Sinfonia's Young Artists Week, culminating in a performance on Friday, July 20, 2012, at the Lake Harriet Bandshell in Minneapolis.

JC SONGWRITERS INSTITUTE • Songwriter students will work with faculty Michelle Whalen and guest songwriter Andy Thompson. Plans are underway to provide the students with a recording studio experience in collaboration with McNally Smith School of Music. The final salon for the Songwriters is on Friday afternoon, July 20.

The public is invited to attend all afternoon salons featuring guest speakers, and the final salons, where pieces composed by students during the previous two weeks will be premiered. \approx

s another Festival year winds down, Cups and certificates are being awarded to Festival students at their recitals throughout the state. And we are reminded of the value of the NFMC Cup Program.

The Festival Cup program not only enables our musicians to earn trophies while participating in music events, it gives them opportunity to set goals and incentive to continue taking lessons and earn bigger (and bigger) cups. It challenges them to take risks and work on more challenging repertoire.

Students in grades 9-12 earn the 75-point requirement for Grand Cup by combining points earned from Difficult Solo Event, Junior 3, and Senior Concerto repertoire.

Preserving Our Cultural Heritage Through Music

re we losing our cultural heritage? Nigel Lythgoe, acclaimed TV/Film director and producer of "American Idol" had much to say about this issue and about how our American culture is not being passed on to future generations.

Mr. Lythgoe comes from England and sees firsthand how young performers do not know, among other things, words to our national anthem. "I'm afraid you are losing your heritage," he told an audience in DC this past April.

Wynton Marsalis asks the same question: "Who will have the courage to teach the most heroic songs and stories of what we have done all over this land and demand that the best of who we are be the national story?"

The answer? We will and we are. The National Federation of Music Clubs is an arts organization whose mission is to promote American Music, and with that, our culture and heritage.

This rings loudly and clearly to me now. After Mr. Lythgoe finished his lecture, I thought about our Festival bulletin and what it includes. We are in a unique position to advocate for the arts while teaching students and our communities about our cultural heritage. Please see the American Patriotic and Folk Song Event in our bulletin, page 87. We can use this section as reference for events other than Festival participation — events such as incorporating folk music into themed recitals and working folk music into our teaching and into our students' ensemble playing.

The *Together We Sing* Booklet, a project of Carol Flatau, is available through the NFMC website.

Let's use our creative resources to challenge ourself to make a difference with this pressing issue. The arts define our culture and play an important role in preserving our culture and our society as we know it.

Wynton Marsalis writes: "Our songs, dances, [and] writings allow us to speak to one another across generations. They gave us an understanding of our commonality long before the DNA told us we are all part of one glorious procession." \approx

Pianist Christopher Norton Visits Minnesota

Christopher Norton, world-renowned pianist and composer, visited Minnesota in June. Christopher, who is best known for his worldwide smash hit series *Microjazz*, was a guest presenter at Minnesota Music Teachers Association's (MMTA) convention on June 5. Piano students and teachers had opportunity to work with, play for and learn from Christopher Norton in both the Twin Cities and Willmar. Other events during his visit included recitals, workshops for teachers and students, piano Festivals, and a gala concert.
