Junior Composers Summer Program 2013

Unior Composers summer program 2013, sporting the theme Words+Music, was held at the University of Minnesota, July 8-20. Thirty-four young composers from around the United States gathered to engage in creativity and to attain higher levels of expression through composing music. In addition to creating musical works, students performed and collaborated to improve each other's work.

Faculty for 2013 were four kid-friendly professional musicians and composers: Dr. Seth Custer, head of the composition department at Bob Jones University in Greenville, SC; Dr. Sarah Miller, composition coordinator at MacPhail Center for Music in St. Paul, MN; Randall Davidson, long-time established composer from Minneapolis and currently Administrative Director of the National Lutheran Choir; and Andy Thompson, prolific songwriter and producer from McNally Smith College of Music in St. Paul, MN.

Readings of student-composed songs were given by well-known Twin Cities soprano Maria Jette, accompanied by Mary Jo Gothmann. Choral works were given a professional reading by The Rose Ensemble of St. Paul. It is a highlight of the Junior Composers' experience to hear their work performed and gently critiqued by professionals.

A typical day at our urban "camp" features theory and ear-training classes, friendship development, private lessons, laughter, quiet breakfasts with sleepy teens and lively lunches with same, leg muscles aching from walking the river bridge to the cafeteria, composing or storytelling until bedtime, daily salons with professionals, and fieldtrips. In 2013, fieldtrips included an evening concert at Lake Harriet and eating hamburgers and ice cream at Annie's Parlour. So

Re-cap of MFMC's 56th Biennial Convention

pplause and accolades to our three hosting clubs for a job well done on the all-member convention — Apple Valley, Burnsville and South Suburban. And thanks to Kathy Wilson, Mary Wescott, and Pat Steege, for pulling together the elements of education, entertainment, and encouragement.

The convention theme, *mp-mf Musical Performance-Minnesota Festival*, was chosen to depict the difference between Day 1 and Day 2 agendas.

Day 1 featured the all-member meeting, election of officers, and the world premier of Chris Wolf's *By Any Other Name*, the middle movement of a commissioned suite of piano solos commemorating MFMC's beloved Rose Zygmanski. Club reports were read and discussed. Dr. Christopher Atzinger and Mr. Doug Rohde instructed participants on how to improve musical performances. Members enjoyed student presentations including a stellar performance by Grand Cup winner Matthew VanRisseghem. Six-year-old Iggy Rosado stole the show wearing a Mozart costume while playing his award winning composition *The Spooky Lion*. Ziggy's mother Shannon Guse was his accompanist. Three students who performed in the Festival honors recital won \$50 each for exceptional performance.

Rudy's Redeye Grill catered the evening banquet, serving their famous prime rib. The tables at Holiday Inn Lakeville were beautifully set with the Inn's elegant black and white linens. NFMC President Carolyn Nelson captivated members with her account of the Federation's 120-year-old history.

Members left the banquet hall (or "waddled out," as Pat Steege phrased it) with gifts of red roses and Abdalla chocolate and proceeded to the concert ballroom. The Day 1 evening performance featured pianist Darin Tsydal who performed a *Tribute to Gershwin* and covered other well-known Gershwin tunes including *I Got Rhythm*, *O Lady be Good*, and *Swanee*. Darin performed three preludes, other concert pieces, and finished with a dreamy *Someone To Watch Over Me* sung by Mary Wescott.

Day 2 dawned with a breakfast buffet of French toast, bacon and eggs and fresh hot coffee. Jeannene Simonson led a reverent memorial service for five deceased MFMC members, lighting a candle for each of the deceased while friends read tributes. Members sang Hymn of Promise from the official NFMC Songbook "**Together We Sing**."

On Day 1, the Junior Composers summer camp program was the subject of reports, financial grants, and conversation. In accordance with the convention theme, Day 2 provided opportunity to sing a composition written by 15-year old Christian Messier of Lakeville. Christian composed his piece at the 2013 JC camp at the U of MN.

Also on Day 2, Judy Zylstra guided members through what is new with Festival for 2014 and what is new in the Bulletin. The National organization, "a dignified elderly lady of traditions," is slowly and carefully bending to the age of technology. Therein lies the need to begin preparing in Minnesota. Festival leaders/ teachers are now required to submit full names (first, middle, last) of all Juniors to the state treasurer by November 1 of each year and pay a \$1.00 per student membership fee. Pat Steege states: "Be aware that eventually birthdates will also be required. By having collected this data ahead of time, we will be better prepared for on-line Festival registration when it finally comes upon us."

National is building a database to track all Festival participants, Juniors and Seniors and their Gold Cup points. This will allow a student who moves to a new location to transfer his/her records without a risk of losing the history of individual trophy points. To put this into perspective, Minnesota has over 5,000 participants in Festival each year; over 90,000 Juniors across the United States participate yearly.
